Research at the University

- Importance of research emphasized in the revised University Research Policy of January 2013
- Establishment of research centres and institutes to focus on research (9)
- Establishment of research libraries to complement research activities (7)
 - Focusing on documentation and dissemination of research output
- Develop and maintain institutional repository
- Support development of local journals (eversions) and publishing both in commercial and open access platforms

Dissemination of research output

- Article 35 of The Constitution of Kenya 2010 guarantees right of access to information by citizens
- Avenues established by the University to enhance access to information
 - Conventional
 - Open access policy
 - Digital repository
 - Publishing in OA platforms e.g. Pubmed

Open Access Policy at UoN

- Process of developing OA policy begun in 2008/2009 through formation of committee
- Policy adopted in December 2012
- University signed Berlin Declaration on Open Access to knowledge in October 2012

* The Open Access Policy will provide our scholars the opportunity and platform to promote their academic work"

Implementation of the Open Access Policy


- Strategies adopted to sensitize users on the policy and the digital repository
 - Use of media to reach alumni
 - Teaching programmes (eg communication skills)
 - Electronic resources trainings conducted by the library
 - College outreach programmes to academic staff
 - University and Library website
 - Email broadcasts
 - Brochures and posters

Operations of the UoN Digital Repository

- Preparation for the Implementation began way back in 2008
- Installation and pilot submission on a temporary server, 2009 – 2010
 - uploaded abstracts, inaugural lectures not copyrighted
 - Not copyrighted/open access full-text
- Hosting on permanent server 2011
- Alive on World Wide Web after approval of OA Policy – November 2012 -<u>http://erepository.uonbi.ac.ke/</u>

Operations cont...

- Available at <u>http://erepository.uonbi.ac.ke/</u>
 - Has total of over 80,000 entries
 - Registered repository and policy with ROAR and OpenDOAR and ROAMAP
- Operates as a non-profit, non-commercial facility
- The Creative Commons End-user license applies to the Digital repository where copyright is owned by member of staff
- In February 2013, UoN became a Foundation member of BioMed Central and receives automatic article feeds


Why UoN Digital Repository?


In Top countries by item views of the past 6 months

Enhancing UoN Digital Repository

- Capacity building and advocacy
- Submission of theses and dissertations on soft copy
- Project to source all UoN historical documents
- Harvesting local content in other site while protecting copyright (check sherpa Romeo site)
- Maintaining integrity to enhance quality
 - plagiarism software subscribed
- Digitization of backlogs outsourced
- Upgrading software and use other s/w tools to enhance visibility of repository e.g bawker syndentic, ORCID, Google Scholar (Exploring altmetrics)
- Established digital Content Unit (Digital repository, Eresources and ICT unit in the library – 6 permanent & 7 on contract)
- Develop subject repositories eg Health Information repository

Implementation successes

- Growth in numbers of items deposited
- High levels of usage noted from the statistics (5.7 million in the last six months)
- Contributed to the excellent performance of the University in Webometrics Ranking
- Contributed to visibility of researchers (many enquiries have been received for funding)



Challenges

Empowerment/sensitization of users so as to fully utilize the resources in the repository

- Awareness of policies
 - Plagiarism, Open access, IP
- Mindset of researchers and distrust/lack of understanding
- Faculty not providing content on a continuous basis to populate the repository
- Lack of understanding of copyright and publisher's policies
- Streamlining systems for comprehensive monitoring quality of research outputs
- Sensitization of authors, researchers, postgraduate students and academic staff at College level

Way Forward & Lessons Learnt

- Sensitize policy makers, and researchers to support the concept.
- University management commitment to support OA Initiatives
- More training/capacity building
- Priority consider IR initiative as core activity/target for budget allocation
- Development of OA policy, plagiarism policy and Successfully Implement the policy
